

ART - YEAR 9

Subject Content

Pupils will learn to:-

- Continue to develop recording skills using a wide variety of media.
- Develop line drawing and tonal work in observed and imaginative work.
- Use clay, paper mache and wire to create 3D/print making/ design work.
- Access the internet as a research tool to find out about artists/schools of art e.g. Surrealism, Pop Art, Abstraction.
- Develop use of the digital camera.
- Work individually and collaboratively

Assessment

Each unit of work is marked to National Curriculum levels.

Homestudy is set weekly and is related to current unit of work in line with school policy. Pupils are advised of their potential grade at GCSE Art during the year to assist with Pathways choices.

Teaching Group Arrangements

Pupils are taught in mixed ability groups and have one 1 hour 15mins per week.
