

## Analysis of GCSE Examination Results for 2015

The GCSE pass rate for 2015 at the threshold of 5+ A\*- C inc EM is 76%; girls achieved 82% and boys 71%. 89% of students achieved 5 A\*-C grades – an improvement of 2% on the 2014 value. 98% of students achieved 5 + A\*-G grades.

70 students studied the English Baccalaureate and 85% achieved this standard.

Historical data for the last three years is as follows:

Results in all subject areas are given below. High standards have been maintained in the core subjects of English, Maths and Science.

The following subjects have shown improvement at A\*-C % compared to 2014: BIS, Computer Science, Economics, English Literature, Drama, Food Technology and Psychology. Media, Statistics and Child Development continue to maintain a 100% pass rate.
