

Trinity Catholic High School GCSE Results 2018

GCSE attainment at Trinity remains outstanding and significantly above national statistics with the school once again securing very high standards at KS4, in addition to making significant improvements on the exceptional results achieved by our students last year. Some of the most significant achievements are as follows:

Summary of Key Headlines

- **Progress 8: +0.47.**
- **Attainment 8: 57.14.**
- **The percentage of students who achieved a strong pass (grade 5 or above) in English and maths is 64%.**
- **The percentage of students achieving the EBacc increased from 20% in the 2016/2017 academic year to 22% in 2018 including the strong pass (grade 5+) in English and mathematics, with 25% achieving the EBacc including the standard pass (grade 4+) in English and mathematics. The average EBacc score per student is 4.86.**
- **The percentage of students staying in education or going into employment after Key Stage 4 is 100%.**
- **The percentage of students achieving 5 or more 9-4/A*-C including English and mathematics is 85%, a 4% increase on the 2016/2017 academic year.**
- **Attainment in the core subjects of English and mathematics remains outstanding, with 89% of students at Trinity achieving 4+ in English and mathematics, an 8% increase on the 2016/2017 academic year.**
- **Overall subject achievement is outstanding at A*/C/9-4. Of the 24 GCSE subjects, 21 achieved 80%+ 9-4/A*-C and 12 subjects achieved 90%+ 9-4/A*-C.**
- **95% of students attained 9-4 in English, a 5% increase on the 2017 result, with 38% of students awarded the higher grades of 9-7. This is significantly above the provisional 16 year-olds national data for English Language at 70% grade 4 or higher and 18% at grade 7 or higher. In English Literature 74% of national entries achieved a grade 4 or higher and 20% a grade 7 or higher.**
- **In mathematics 90% of our students achieved 9-4, a significant increase of 6% on the 2016/2017 result at this threshold and 27% at the higher grades of 9-7. This is significantly above the provisional 16 year-olds national data in mathematics at 71% grade 4 or higher and 20% at grade 7 or higher.**
- **Overall GCSE attainment at the top end continues to be exceptional with 34% of students achieving A*-A/9-7. With reformed GCSEs this year, grades 9-7 cover the range previously covered by grades A*-A in legacy subjects.**
- **6% of all grades at Trinity were a 9 or A* with 28% of students achieving 5+ A*-A/9-7 and 13% of our students achieving 8+ A*-A/9-7 grades.**
